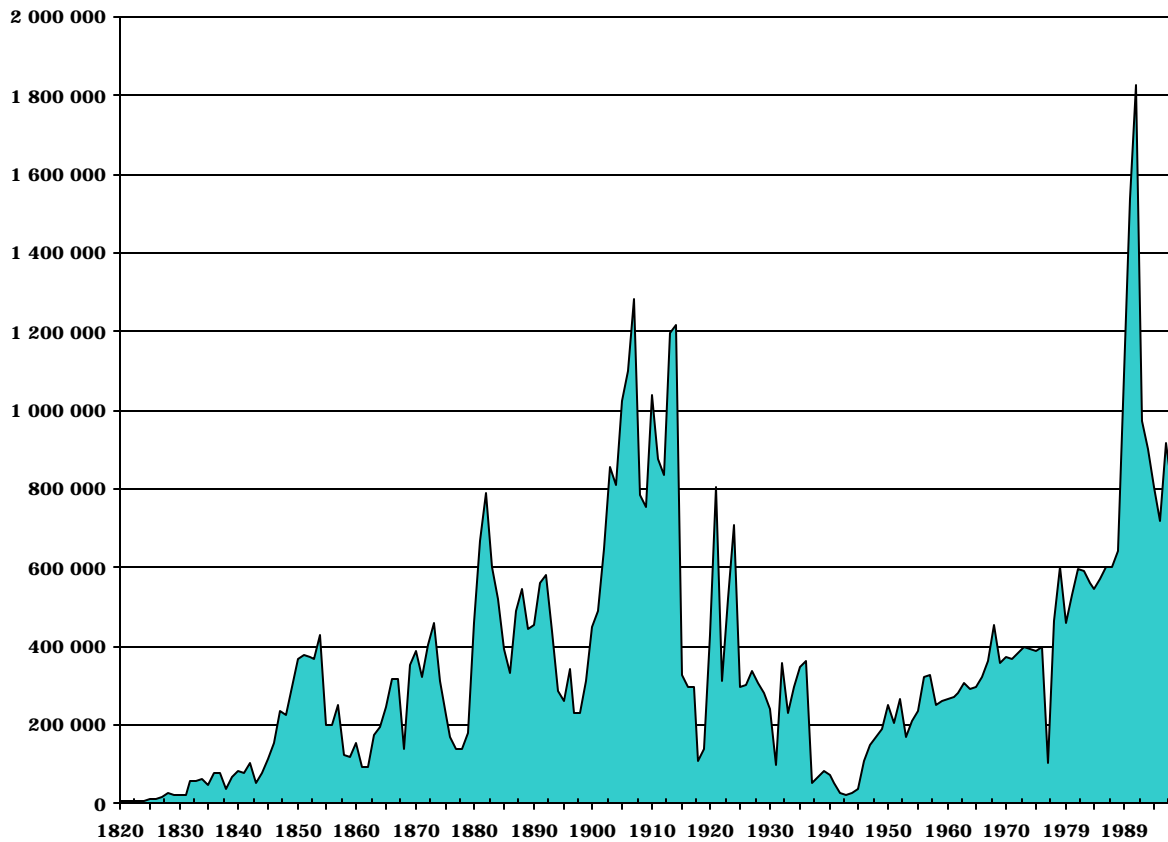

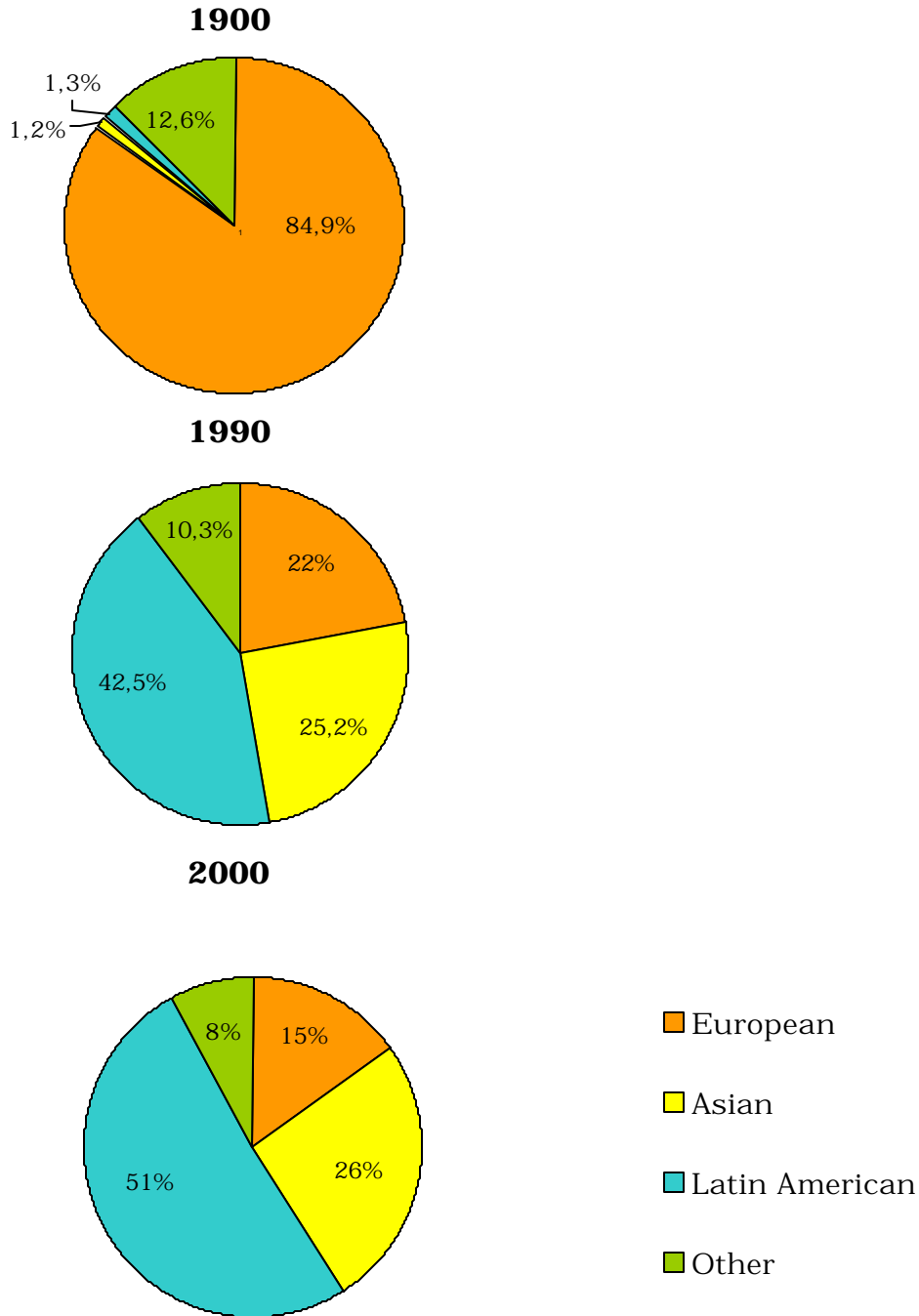
The numbers shown are distorted as follows:

- From 1892-94 and 1898-1998, immigrant aliens admitted for permanent residence

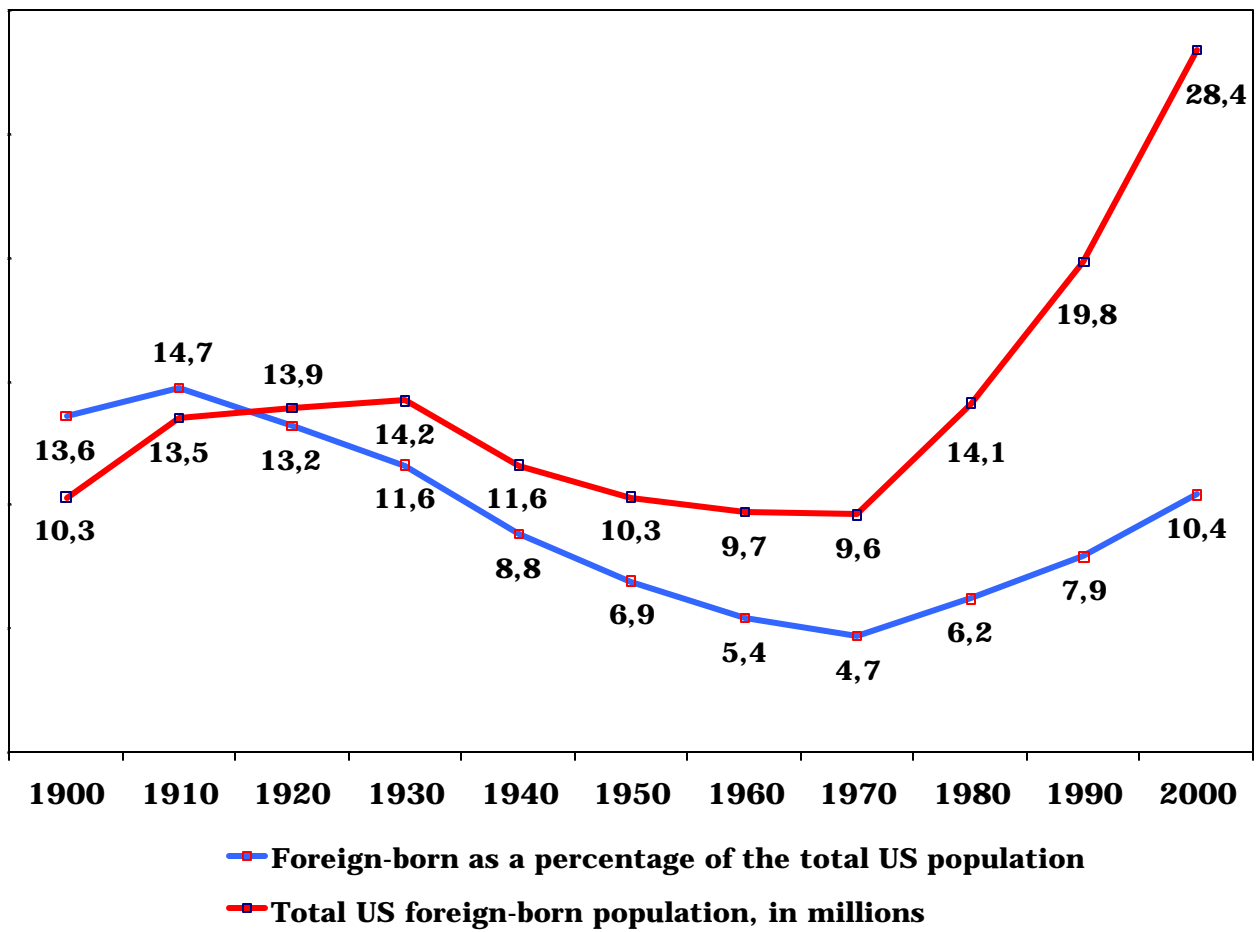
From 1892-1903, aliens entering by cabin class were not counted as immigrants. Land arrivals were not completely enumerated until after 1908.

PERCENTAGE OF FOREIGN-BORN BY REGION OF BIRTH

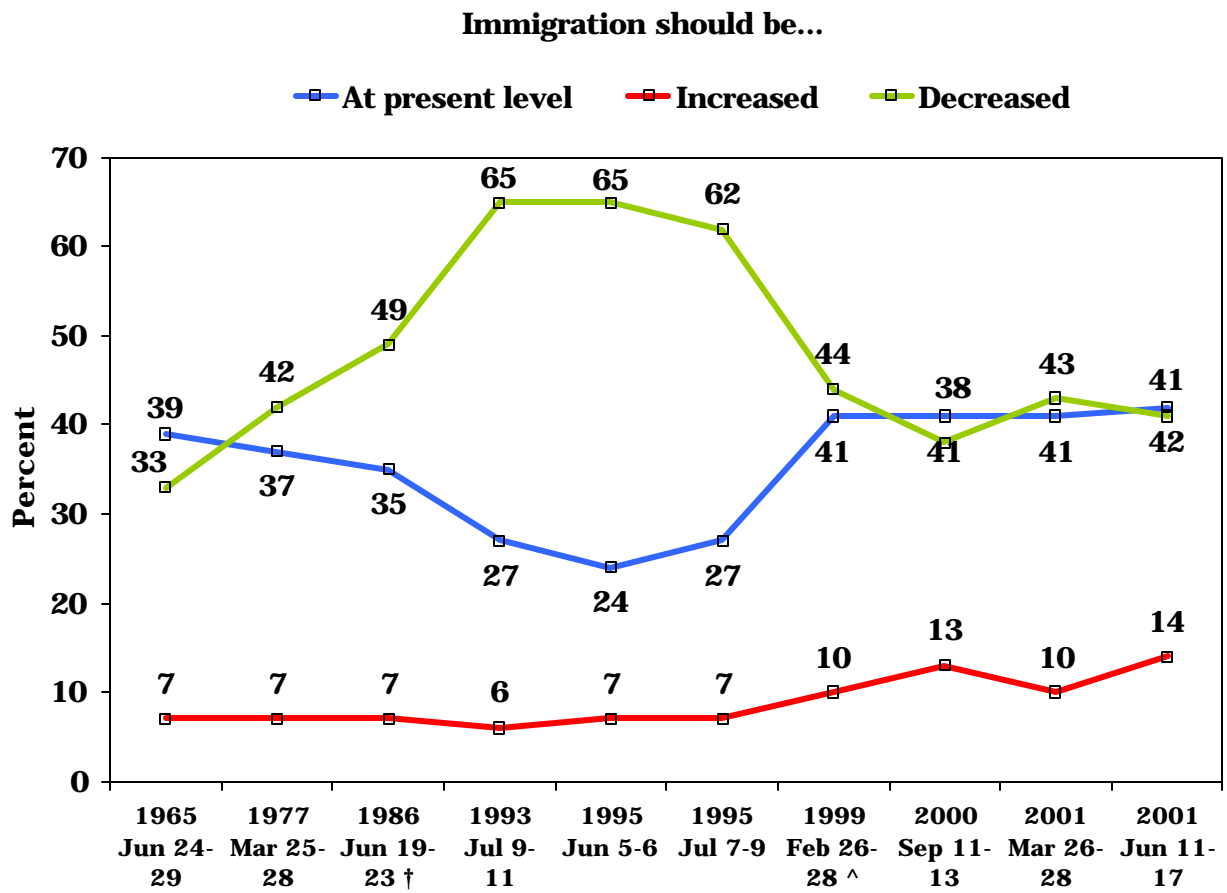
