Languages in Arkansas

- Pulaski County's 34 languages tied for the 266th highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Arkansas counties that were highly ranked included: Washington County (t-287) and Benton County (t-427).
- Arkansas has the second highest percentage of speakers of Marshallese in the United States. The Natural State also ranks third in the percentage of Cherokee and Choctaw speakers, sixth in the percentage of English speakers, and seventh in the percentage of Cajun speakers.
- Washington County has the third highest percentage of Marshallese speakers of any county in the nation.
