Languages in Ohio

- Franklin County's 81 languages represented the 33rd highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Ohio counties that were highly ranked included: Cuyahoga County (t-35), Hamilton County (t-73), Summit County (t-116), Montgomery County (t-151), and Lucas County (t-164).
- Ohio has the highest percentage of speakers of Slovene in the United States. The Buckeye State also ranks second in the percentage of Pennsylvania Dutch and Slovak speakers and third in the percentage of Hungarian speakers.
- Holmes County has the highest percentage of Pennsylvania Dutch speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Lake County (first, Croatian), Lake County (first, Slovene), Holmes County (second, Dutch), Cuyahoga County (third, Hungarian) and Mahoning County (third, Slovak).
